





### DR ANDREW LEMON

Dr Andrew Lemon is the foremost expert on the history of horse racing in Australia. Andrew is consultant historian to the Victoria Racing Club. He has served on Victoria's Heritage Council, the State Library of Victoria Board, and is a past-president of the Royal Historical Society of Victoria.

### **DR IAIN BUCKLAND**

lain has Scottish family connections, which has inspired him to academic and practical interest in the unique culinary traditions of Scotland. His paper examines the growth in illicit whisky distilling & smuggling in Scotland in the late 18th century and Robert Burns' role in attempting to prevent it.



### DR RUTH PULLIN

Dr Ruth Pullin is the leading world expert on the paintings and sketch books of the artist, Eugene von Guerard. Ruth is an independent art historian, curator and von Guérard specialist. She has held fellowships at the State Library of New South Wales and the State Library of Victoria, her research has been published in Australian and international journals.

### **DAVID JELLIE**

David's career as a structural design engineer has brought him many uniqie opportunities. He participated in the development of Australian design codes and has written many papers and books - mainly relating to construction and safety in construction. He was appointed an Adjunct Professor at RMIT University. In 2001 and created his own consulting practice.



### DR IAN D CLARK

Ian has been researching and publishing in Victorian Aboriginal history since 1982. He has been the Centre Manager of the Brambuk Aboriginal Cultural Centre at Halls Gap, and Research Fellow in History at the Australian Institute for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies in Canberra.

### WARRNAMBOOL PIPES & DRUMS (WADPADI)

Formed in 1907, WADPADI has the record as one of the longest, continually functioning pipe bands.

Camperdown-based community music group Tuniversal performs songs and music from the Celtic tradition. The group auspice the festival.

### **OUR STORY**

Our festival centres around Camperdown's Robert Burns statue. Created in Scotland in 1830, the statue is the only one to have been based exclusively on the earliest known portrait of Burns.

Early Western District settler W.A Taylor gifted the statue to the community of Camperdown in 1883 where it was placed in the Camperdown Public Park (Botanic Gardens). It remained here for more than 125 years.

The statue was already in need of restoration when in 2009, it was vandalised. Following the attack, the statue was moved so that its restoration & future protection could be assessed.

Local residents joined with supporters from across the globe to fundraise to restore the statue and have it placed in a location where it could be safe and appreciated by future generations.

The Robert Burns statue can be viewed at the Civic Centre in Camperdown over the festival weekend SAT/SUN from 10-2 for viewing access.
